WELCOME BACK!!!




STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

The sessions for KG mentors by Patronus Academy on “Communication Skill” and “Eurythmy as a Pedagogy” was conducted on 04.06.22 and 25.06.22 respectively. Mentors learnt new techniques on inculcating Eurythmy in story-telling, rhymes, teaching spelling and grammar. Eurythmy is not only a physical activity, it also develops the child's listening skill and pronunciation. The resource person, Ms. Sheeja Nair, shared various strategies that could boost interaction in the class.

A Lesson Plan workshop was conducted by the Principal, Mrs. Radhamani, on 25/6/22, for the new mentors and the Primary handling mentors to write a structured studentcentric lesson plan, which would lead to active participation and involvement of the students in the classroom. The facilitator explained, “The Big Ideas” of all the subjects and how to arrive at the core objective. It focused on the different segments in lesson plan, like the ELO, Methodology and strategy according to the topic.



SESSION ON “COMBATING ANTIBIOTIC RESISTANCE”





Std. VI-XII: Band, Silambam, Karate, Scouts & Guides, JRC, Yoga, Art & Craft.




VIRTUAL REACH OUT
