


Two students, Surya B and Bathala Pradosh Nirmal, under the guidance of their Science teacher, Mrs. Shantha participated in the National Children's Science Congress (NCSC) conducted by the Department of Science and Technology, under the Program of NSCTC, Government of India. Their project 'TAN IT GREEN' was based on developing alterna-

tive tanning methods of leather, and making a smart leather factory, for which they were taken to the tannery at Pallavaram. The factory manager took them around, and explained the process of making and tanning leather, and also the process of treating polluted water. The visit helped them to understand the process of alternative methods of tanning leather.

She taught the mentors to calculate the value of BMI using height and weight. The signs and symptoms of obesity were briefed, and the risk factors due to obesity were explained. She also highlighted on a healthy lifestyle, physical exercise, healthy food, and advised all to keep a check on the blood pressure and weight.



SESSION ON 'THE SEVEN HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE PEOPLE' FOR MENTORS (III- XII) BY STUDENT COUNSELLOR-20.9.'23



The session was completely an activity based session, where 'The Seven Habits' of highly effective people, were explained through seven different activities. The mentors enjoyed the session, and all of them participated in the activities with a lot of enthusiasm. They were able to understand the importance of implementing the seven habits in their routine, to become effective in their personal, and professional lives.
