

A guest lecture on "Robotics" was arranged by the Galileo Science Club, where Prof S. Thanigaiarasu threw light on the parts, and the working of a drone, which kindled the scientific curiosity of the students. The Fab and Fit Wellness Club arranged a guest lecture on "Balanced Diet". The resource person, Mrs. Vijaya Paul highlighted the importance of nutrients, and the need for maintaining a balanced diet in children. All the other clubs conducted interesting activities, which created an enriching experience for the students.

### ORIENTATION FOR EMBIBE

EMBIBE is a learning platform that enables a student to enhance his quest for knowledge. An orientation programme on the usage of the EMBIBE platform was conducted on 6.10.2023. About a hundred students from classes 11 and 12 were briefed on the details and advantages of the Embibe platform. The resource person was Mrs. Visalakshi, who enlightened the students on how they should log in, go about with the assignments and assessments, and effectively use the study materials available, etc. Using the AI techniques, students are tested with different degrees of questions. Embibe also facilitates the students to appear for different competitive exams. The students attended the two-hour session with great enthusiasm, and were enlightened on the usage of Embibe.

## NMTC by AMTI -07.10.23

The National Mathematics Talent Contest (NMTC) is a prestigious mathematics competition, that encourages and recognizes mathematical excellence among students. The preliminary exam of the NMTC was conducted on 7th October, 2023, at our school. The NMTC is organised by the Association of Mathematics Teachers of India (AMTI), and this year, 100 of our students participated in the preliminary round. Out of the hundred, eleven students qualified for the final round of the NMTC, which will be conducted on 4th November, 2023. The students who qualified, demonstrated exceptional mathematical aptitude, problem-solving skills, and dedication to the subject. The students' performance in the preliminary exam reflects positively on the quality of mathematics education in our school. The final exam on 4th November, 2023, will be a crucial opportunity for our students to further showcase their mathematical talents. We encourage all students to put in their best effort and represent our school with pride.



### WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY 10.10.'23



To observe World Mental Health Day, several events were scheduled on 10.10.23. Firstly, the student counsellors addressed the mentors on how they can normalise seeking aid for mental health, and help shatter the stigma attached to it. For the students, a Poster Making Competition (VI-VIII) and an Oratorical Competition (IX-XII) were conducted on the topic

"Mental Health is a Human Right". A large number of students showed keen

interest in participating in both the competitions. Following this, a street play was performed by the students of IX -XII to raise awareness on mental health. This was done with an objective to increase mental health awareness, not just among students, but also to the general public. The street play was also broadcast in the Makkal TV channel, and News 7 channel.



### INDUSTRIAL VISIT-SARAOGI UNIFORM PVT LTD - 10.10.2023



The Commerce students of Std XI and XII were taken to Saraogi Uniforms Pvt Ltd., in Nerkundram, on the 10th and 12<sup>th</sup> of October, 2023, to gain knowledge on the real working environment of an industry, and to get a better understanding of the process involved in manufacturing, or producing a product, and how different parts of the industry

work together. The students were divided into batches, were provided with a manual on the production process, and taken to the production unit in order to understand the process of garment manufacturing, from pre-production to post-production. The visit encompassed a factory tour, showcasing the various stages of uniform production. This educational visit left a lasting impression on the students, highlighting the importance of practical learning and industry experience, in the students' academic journey.



### **WOW WRITER'S SESSION -13.10.23**

To foster the skills of writing, Ms. Megha Bajaj, the author of 'WOW' conducted a story telling session 'WOW BOOK PROJECT 2023', through a virtual training session on 13.10.2023. The main objective of the session was to create a platform for the students to share their views on the 'LOVE MOVEMENT' through story writing, and also to allow them to explore their own imaginative potential, and literary flair for creative writing. The session was highly interactive. Ms. Megha Bajaj emphasized the importance of using stories to connect with the audience.

The session started with a meaningful interaction with the students on the topic 'LOVE'. Moving deeper into the topic, the speaker enlightened them on how to write a story with a proper beginning, middle and end. A quiz on the childhood, achievements, books, and scientific contributions of Dr. Kalam was conducted for the students of Std VI to VIII.

Students of classes IX and X delivered a talk on learning from failures. XI and XII students did collage work on the importance of education and students in the society. Students actively participated in all the activities.

### SESSION ON PERCEIVING PERSONAL SPACE

A session on "Perceiving Personal Space" was conducted by the Student Counsellors, for Std. I & II students on 16.10.2023, and 17.10.2023 respectively. # KNOWLEDGE SHARING WITH GUANGYANG SECONDARY SCHOOL, SINGAPORE - 24.10.'23

The delegates from Guangyang Secondary School, Singapore, visited N.S.N Memorial School on 24/10/23 for cultural exchange, and collaborative learning. Mr. Anbalagan, vice-principal, Ms. Sagayarani, Tamil teacher and Ms. Ratna, Teacher observed 3 Tamil classes and 1 English class. They shared their teach-



ing strategy where they focus only on listening, reading, and speaking skills whereas we focus on writing skills too. They also focus on creative writing which enhances the thinking skill rather than rote learning. Grammar which is taught in-depth, was observed by them in the classes. # SESSION ON THE WORKING OF CUSTOMS HOUSE AGENTS (CHA) - 20.10.2023



On 20th of October 2023, an enlightening session was organized for the commerce students of Class 11 and 12, focusing on the world of international trade. The guest speaker, Mrs.Vidhya Nair, General Manager (South) Abreco Freight Pvt Ltd., Chennai, provided a valuable opportunity for students to explore the intricate field of international trade. The session commenced with an activity where two students played the roles of a consignor and a consignee. This practical exercise gave students a deeper

insight into the concepts of imports and exports. It effectively set the stage for an engaging learning experience. Mrs. Vidhya Nair went on to explain the modes of trade, and the key stakeholders involved in the transportation of goods. This session was particularly enlightening, shedding light on the operations of customs, and the commercial documentation integral to international trade. The students were especially intrigued by the role of customs housing agents, a subject that was previously unfamiliar to many. The students were left with a profound understanding of the basics of CHA. This knowledge sparked their curiosity and left them eager to delve deeper into the world of international trade. The interactive Q&A session that concluded the presentation, further fueled the students' interest. The session had changed some students' perspectives on customs and international trade. Some were inspired to consider a career in this field, recognizing the potential it holds for their future endeavours.

### SPELL BEE CONTEST:

A Spell Bee Contest was conducted for the students of Std. I to VIII to improve students' vocabulary, memory, and confidence. Two preliminary rounds were conducted, and the final round consisted of six top ranking students, who participated with great enthusiasm and confidence. The final three students were selected as winners. It was a tough competition, well cheered and motivated by the audience.





### CAREER ASSESSMENT FOR STD X.

A lot of students struggle to explore the domains in which their career interests lie. To help students navigate this situation, a Career Assessment is conducted every year for all the students of class X, to help determine their career interests. This can aid them in choosing the group of their choice in class XI. The assessment utilized for this purpose is Holland's RIASEC Career Interests Assessment.

Early intervention is identifying children who might have problems in future, and this enables the teacher to empower children, and educate the parents on their children's condition. The following suggestions were given to teachers.

- 1.Do not generalize (Parents/grandparents will come up with generalize tion like, the child is doing so, because the father or mother was also like that)
- 2. Do not make assumptions.
- 3. Do not let the children's charm cloud your observation.
- 4. Understand child's level of development and enable the child without labelling.
- 5. Keep child's background in your mind.

An activity was given to teachers to list the general milestones to be reached at different age levels, from child birth to 5 years. Teachers participated enthusiastically and performed the activity. Different areas of development were discussed, and the eight multiple intelligences were explained in detail. The sessions were very informative and effective, and the trainees had many a take away to be implemented in their classrooms, to make their teaching effective.

# SESSION ON 'DEVELOPING AND ADDING MY CREATIVITY TO MY TEACH-ING'
