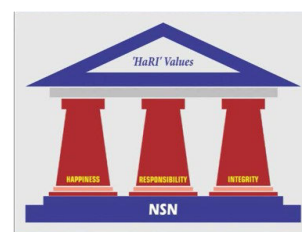

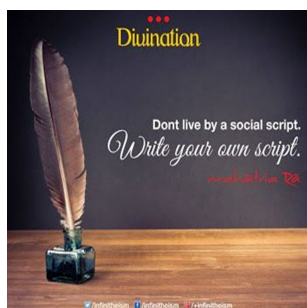

minds with positive thoughts. The event was very successful, with a large number of students taking part, and most of them could quote verbatim, all the ten quotes, without any error.

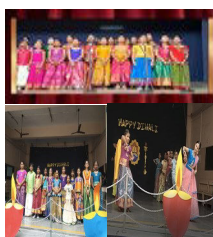


BLUE COLOUR DAY

Voracious readers were identified, and made to talk about their joyful reading experience, and about any one favourite book in the assembly. A Book Talk by the readers in each class during lunch hour, created an interest in reading for the peer group. To kindle the curiosity of the students, the notice board titled 'JUMBLED COMIC STORY' was updated with pictures numbered from a comic story. The students had to write the numbers in the correct sequence and drop in the drop-box. The correct answers were displayed on the notice board the next day. The students of Std. VI – VIII had the activity "FIND THE ANSWERS", in which the notice board was updated with a short story/article. Few questions were posted, and the students had to write the answers in a chit, and drop it in the drop-box. The best answers were displayed on the notice board. 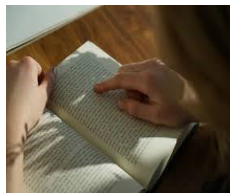
DEAR TIME (Drop Everything And Read)

STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

ONLINE PHONIC SESSION

A one week online phonic session was arranged for the kindergarten teachers. This online session gave a lot of insight on the right pronunciation, how to prepare lesson plans for phonic class, difference between phonetics and phonics, how to teach the sounds to children etc. Many useful teaching resources were also shared during the session.

MDA SESSION



A two-day workshop was conducted by Madras Dyslexia Association to empower the kindergarten teachers on early intervention of Dyslexic children. Different teaching strategies to engage all types of learners in the classroom were given. Teachers were given a checklist to identify children with dyslexia. Teachers' queries were answered, and doubts were cleared.



WORKSHOP ON INNOVATIVE TEACHING METHODOLOGY:



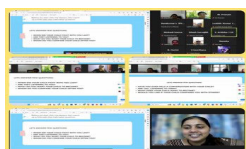

SESSION ON PARENTING STYLES BY THE STUDENT COUNSELLOR



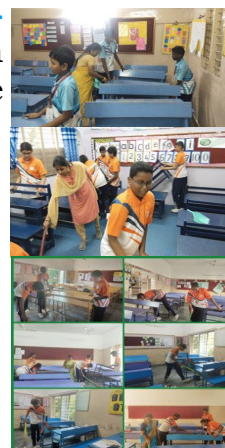
