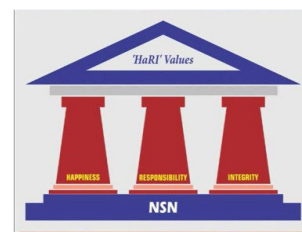

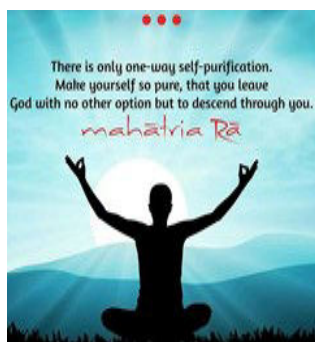

FIELD TRIP TO THE BIRLA PLANETARIUM



The members of the Galileo Science Club from Std VI-IX visited the Birla Planetarium on 19.01.24, to have a better understanding of the constellations and the solar system.
