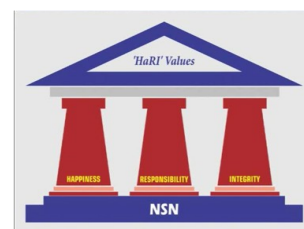

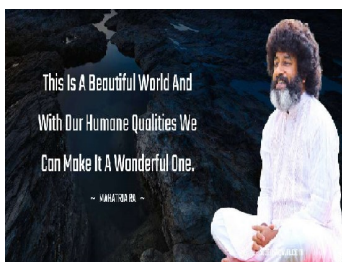

RED COLOUR DAY

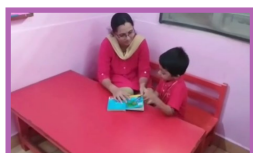

‘ALL ABOUT ME’ THEME DAY



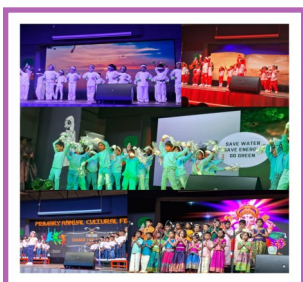

GURU VANDANAM



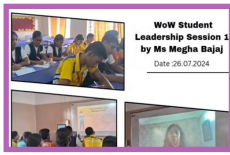

THIRUKKURAL RECITATION COMPETITION

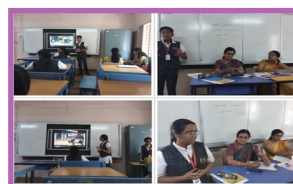
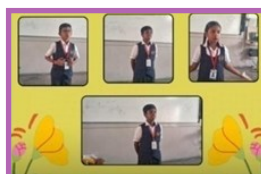
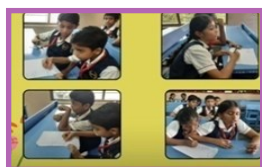

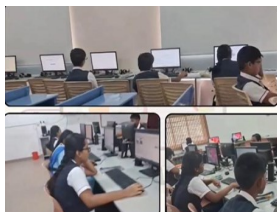
DEAR TIME

ORIENTATION SESSION FOR MODEL UNITED NATIONS (MUN)

STUDENT COUNSELLORS' & STAFF NURSES' SESSIONS

SESSION ON PERSONAL GROOMING FOR BOYS OF STD VI To VIII



A grooming session for the boys of Std VI to VIII, was conducted on 2.7.'24, by the staff nurse, focusing on personal appearance and hygiene. The session covered important aspects such as maintaining neatness, proper hair and nail trimming, and daily use of deodorant. Participants received practical tips on self-grooming techniques. The aim was to highlight the importance of personal grooming, in creating a positive impression and maintaining overall hygiene and well-being.



SESSION ON MENSTRUAL HYGIENE FOR GIRLS OF STD VI To VIII



A session on menstrual hygiene was conducted by the staff nurse for the students of Std VI -VIII, on 1.7.'24, which emphasized on hygienic practices to prevent infection during menstruation. The importance of cleanliness and maintaining hygiene while menstruating, were also discussed. Guidance on using pads and changing them every 4 to 6 hours, were insisted. An awareness on the proper disposal of sanitary napkins was also included. Overall, the session educated students on menstrual hygiene practices, and empowered them to take care of their health during menstruation, in a hygienic and responsible manner.



SESSION ON EMOTIONAL HYGIENE



From 29.7.'24 to 31.7.'24, the student counsellor conducted sessions on Emotional Hygiene, for students in classes VI-VIII. The main goal was to help students understand and manage their emotions. This session was the first step in teaching students how to cope with emotional changes and effectively address their mental health.



SESSION ON ORAL HYGIENE FOR STD III-V



On 8.7.'24 and 9.7.'24, Dr. Aishwarya Arunkumar, Chief Dentist and Founder of 'Frontier Dentist,' and faculty at Sathyabama Dental College, educated the students of Std III-V, on the importance of oral hygiene. She emphasized on regular brushing, inter-dental cleaning, flossing, a healthy diet, limiting sugary foods, tongue cleaning, and staying hydrated. Dr. Aishwarya also demonstrated proper brushing techniques. The students actively engaged, and understood that good oral hygiene is crucial for healthy teeth, gums, and overall well-being.

SESSION ON SAFE AND UNSAFE TOUCH



The Student Counsellor conducted a session on "Safe and Un-safe Touch" for KG and Primary students, to raise awareness on different types of touches. The session covered safe, un-safe, and unfriendly touches, teaching children to report uncomfortable touches to a teacher or parent. A video was shown to help students recognize these touches, and a questionnaire was used to assess their understanding of the topic.

SESSION ON DENTAL HYGIENE FOR STD I & II

On 8.7.'24 and 9.7.'24, the students of Std I and II were briefed by the staff nurse on the importance of dental hygiene. A video was shown to highlight the significance of proper dental care and methods to maintain it. The staff nurse also explained to the young students, the crucial role that healthy teeth play in overall health. The students responded well to the questions posed by the staff nurse.



MASS COUNSELLING FOR STUDENTS

Mass Counselling for students began on 8.7.'24. The primary objective is to create a safe and comfortable space for students to share their concerns, and receive support. This initiative provides accessible mental health support, and educates students on managing their challenges.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

SPECIAL EDUCATOR'S SESSION



A session for Kindergarten and Primary teachers was held at N.S.N Matriculation Higher Secondary School on 26.7.'24. Led by Mrs. T. Pallavi, a prominent expert in special education, the workshop focused on enhancing skills to support reading, and spelling difficulties in early learners. Topics included spelling rules, reading strategies, and practical implementation tips. The session concluded with a Q&A segment, allowing teachers to discuss specific classroom challenges. This training aimed at helping teachers create a more engaging and inclusive learning environment.



SESSION ON LEARNING OUTCOMES AND PEDAGOGIES

SESSION ON A WELL BALANCED DIET FOR THE SUPPORT STAFF



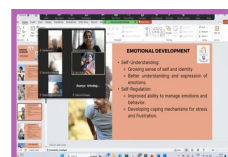

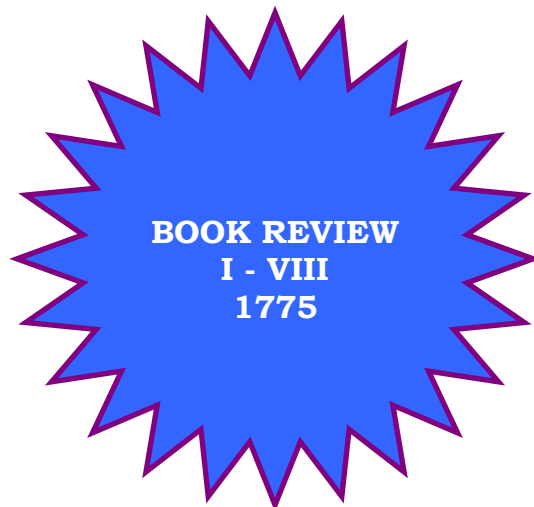


EXCURSION TO YELAGIRI HILLS - STD XI & XII
