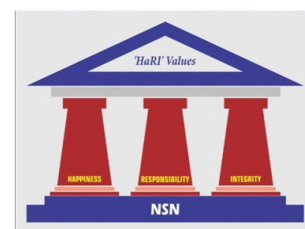

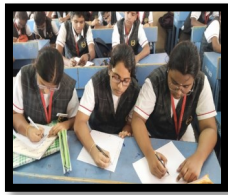


## INDEPENDENCE DAY - 15.8.'24

The contest, which included students from grades V-XII, featured four levels: Primary, Sub-Junior, Junior, and Intermediate. The exam comprised multiple-choice, fill-in-the-blanks, and problem-solving questions, with 226 students participating.

The contest aims to foster creative and original thinking, preparing students to tackle complex problems and enhance their mathematical skills. It provides an opportunity for students to refine their critical thinking and build confidence in their mathematical abilities.

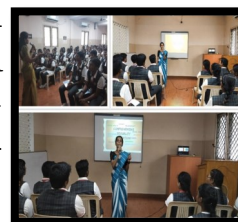

## **STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS**

### **CBP - ACTIVE LEARNING -24.08.'24**



NSN Memorial School hosted a CBSE Capacity Building Programme on Active Learning, aimed at enhancing mentors' skills for future-ready education. Led by Dr. Aruna Appasamy and Mrs. Jaya Prasad, the session engaged participants in activities highlighting Active Learning principles.

Through group and individual tasks, mentors explored Active Learning concepts, insights from Indian philosophers, learning principles, challenges, 21st-century skills, and teaching strategies. The program stressed the importance of hands-on and active learning strategies to foster student success, curiosity, and analytical skills. Mentors left equipped with practical strategies for planning engaging and effective lessons.

### **PRIMARY TEACHERS' WORKSHOP ON MULTIPLE INTELLIGENCES-24.8.'24**

Primary teachers attended a workshop on Multiple Intelligences led by Special Educators Mrs. Vidhya and Mrs. Pallavi. The session covered Howard Gardner's eight intelligences and their classroom applications. Teachers engaged in activities and self-assessments to identify their dominant intelligences, helping them support students' strengths better. The workshop emphasized integrating Multiple Intelligence activities into lesson plans to enhance personalized learning experiences, and deepened teachers' understanding of student diversity.



## **CEECT SESSION 2: ENHANCING COMMUNICATION SKILLS FOR TEACHERS-31.8.'24**

Session 2 of the CEECT featured guest speaker Mrs. Tejal Mohanarangam, who focused on enhancing teachers' communication skills. She covered the 4Ps of verbal communication: Power, Pace, Pause, and Pitch, and the importance of non-verbal cues like body language and eye contact. The session concluded with practical tips on vocal health, offering valuable insights and advice for teachers.

- Managing large classes and multiple intelligence





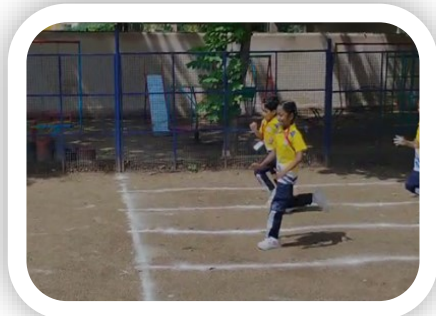
## **CARING FOR VISION AND SMILES: EYE AND DENTAL CAMP FOR OUR STUDENTS**
