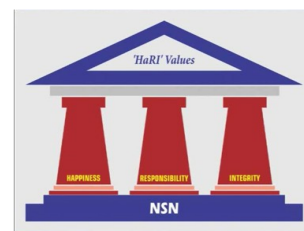

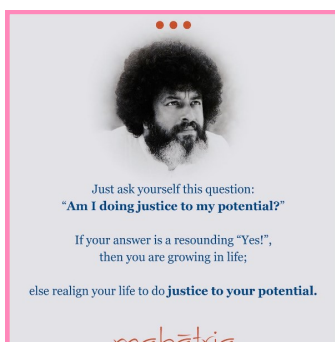

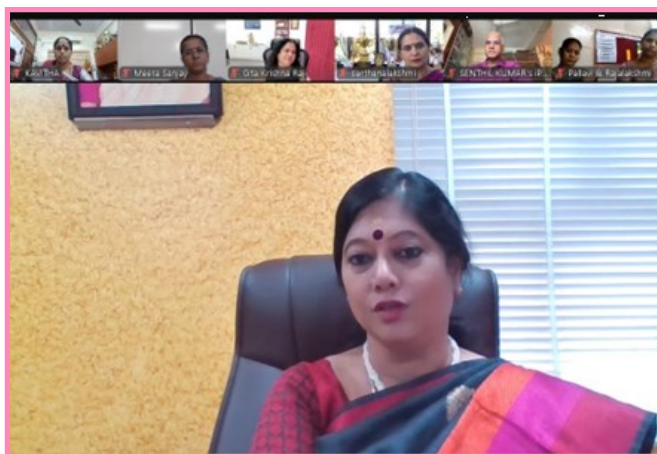
## PERFORMANCE REVIEW MEETING-I (PRM) - ACADEMIC

## SCHOOL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING-I

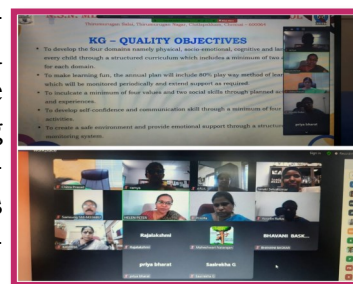

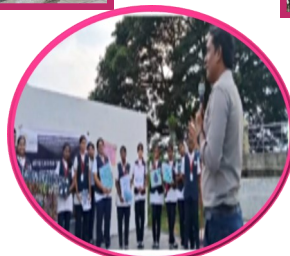
## **STREET PLAY ON SUSTAINABILITY AND WATER**

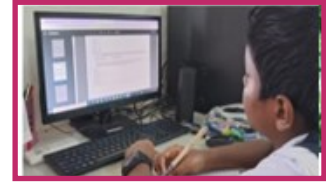
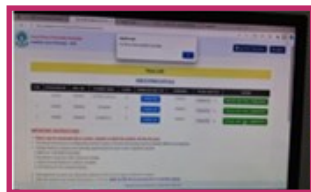
## **SOF OLYMPIADS**

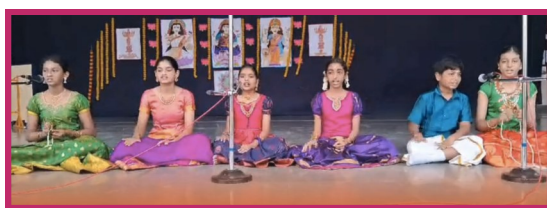
## NAVARATRI PROGRAM AT KUMARAN KUNDRAM TEMPLE

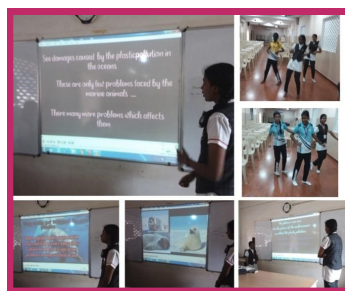
## **SPREADING AWARENESS THROUGH ART ON MENTAL HEALTH DAY**

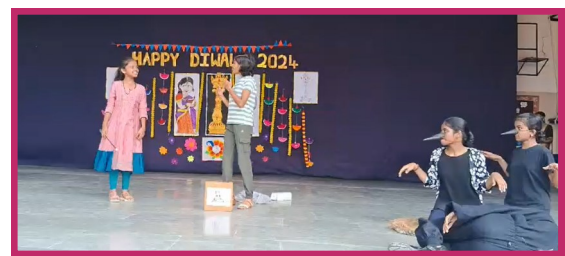
## **DIWALI - SPECIAL ASSEMBLY**

## **SESSIONS BY OUR ALUMNI:**

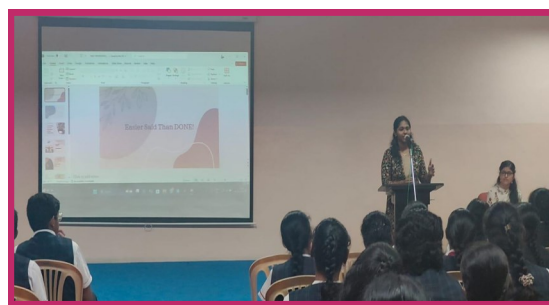
### **SESSION ON ORAL HYGIENE**

### **SESSION ON TEACHING STRATEGIES IN MATH FOR MENTORS 9.10.'24**

The workshop, led by subject experts, focused on CBSE sample paper analysis, High-Order Thinking (HOT) questions, and probable board exam topics. Mentors received handouts for practice and clarified doubts, making the session highly informative and equipping them to better support their students.

### **HANDLING CHILDREN AT FOUNDATIONAL STAGE**

## **SUBJECT EXPERT SESSION FOR PHYSICS MENTORS**

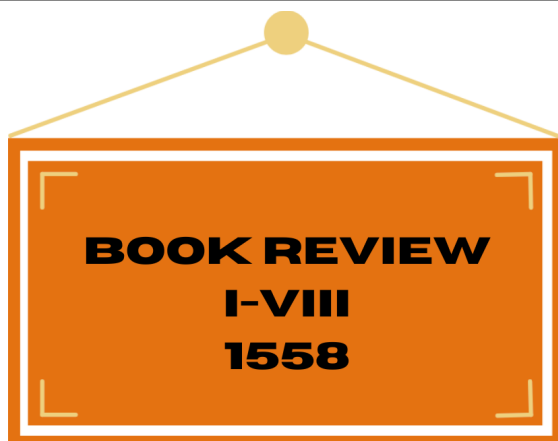
