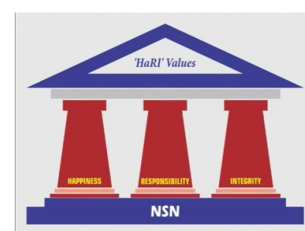

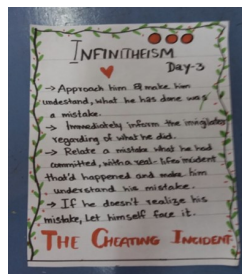
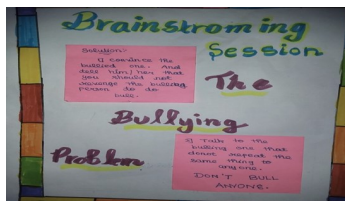
## MOTIVATIONAL TALKS BY NSN STUDENTS

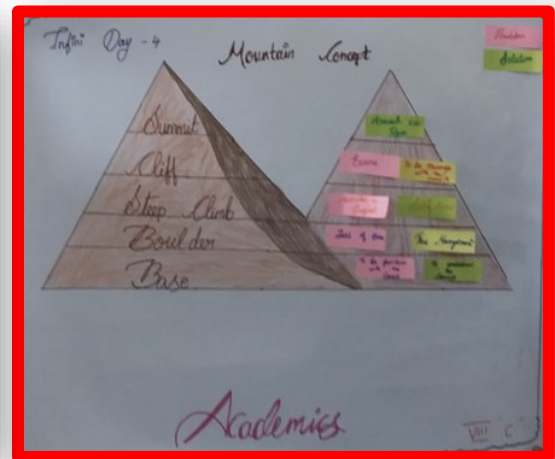


## INFINI DAY 11.11.'24
