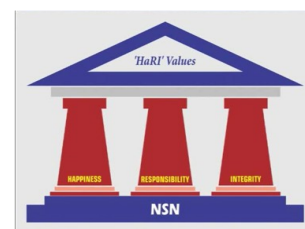

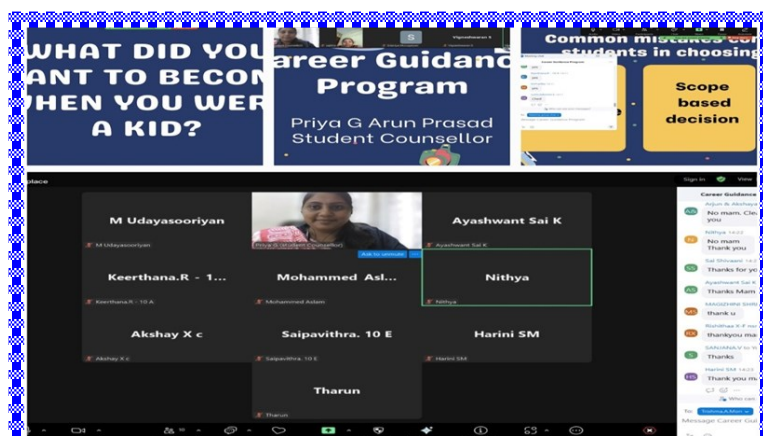
JOY OF LOVING 2025: CULTIVATING SELF-LOVE

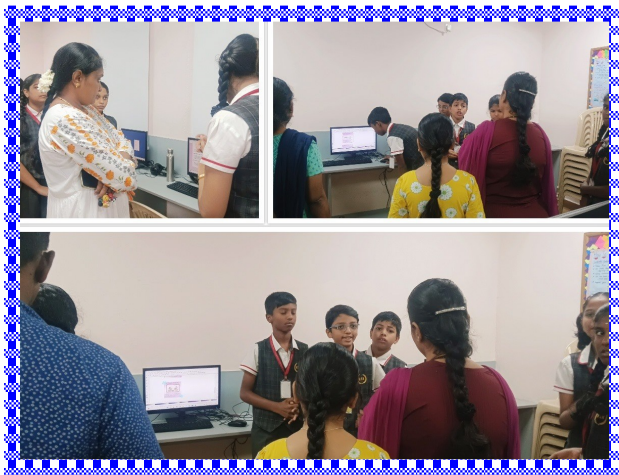
PROJECT ON SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

BOUQUET OF THANKS AT NSN GROUP OF SCHOOLS

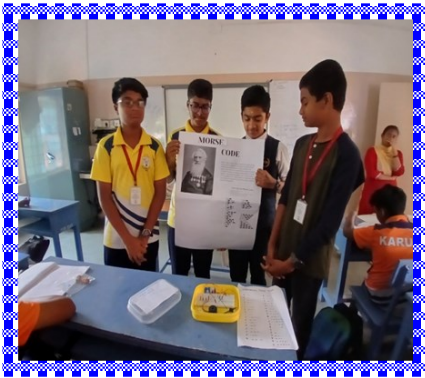
