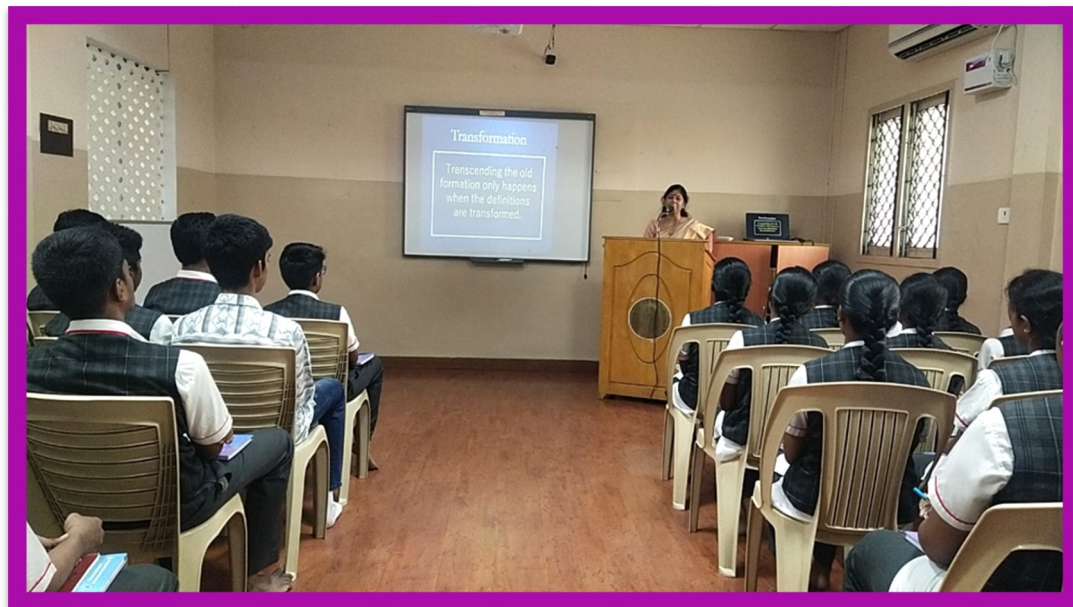
CORRESPONDENT'S SESSION FOR THE STUDENTS OF STD XI & XII

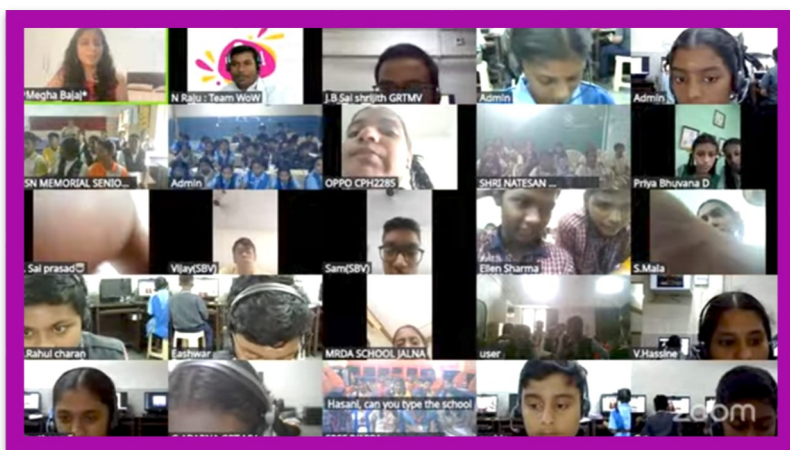
AUTHORS' INSIGHT SESSION FOR SELECT STUDENTS OF STD VIII TO XII

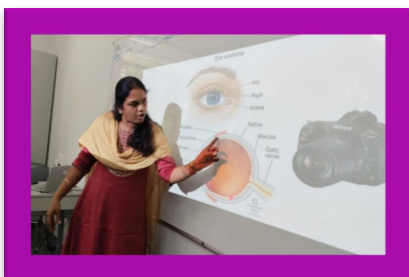
MUSIC CONCERT BY CARNATIC VIOLINIST DR. D. NARMADA, ORGANISED BY SPICMACAY
