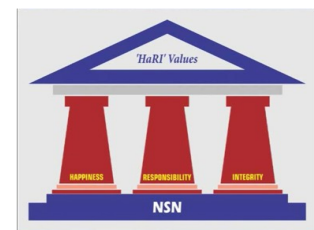

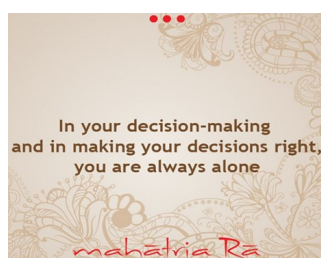

NATIONAL NUTRITION WEEK CELEBRATIONS

1st September 2025 to 4th September 2025 was observed as Nutrition Awareness Week, a time to highlight the importance of healthy eating, and promote positive food habits among students. Each level actively participated through engaging and informative activities.

STD XI & XII (1.9.25): Two students delivered a speech on the ill effects of junk food, followed by a skit that emphasized the harmful impact of unhealthy eating choices and encouraged students to adopt nutritious diets.

HINDI DIWAS

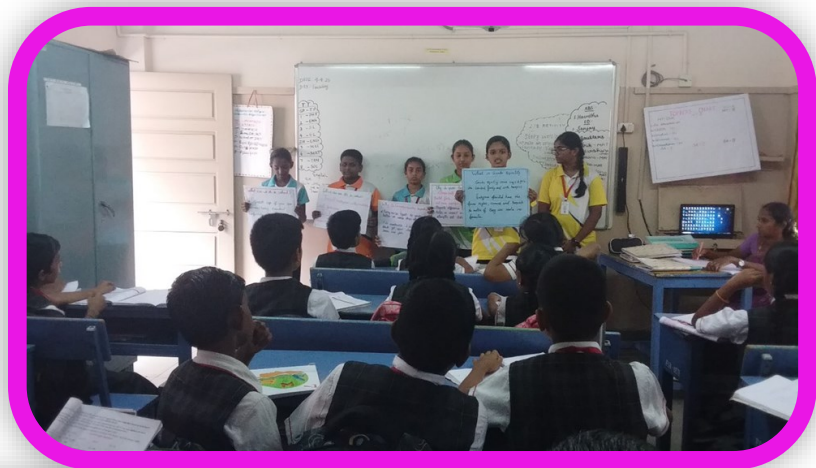

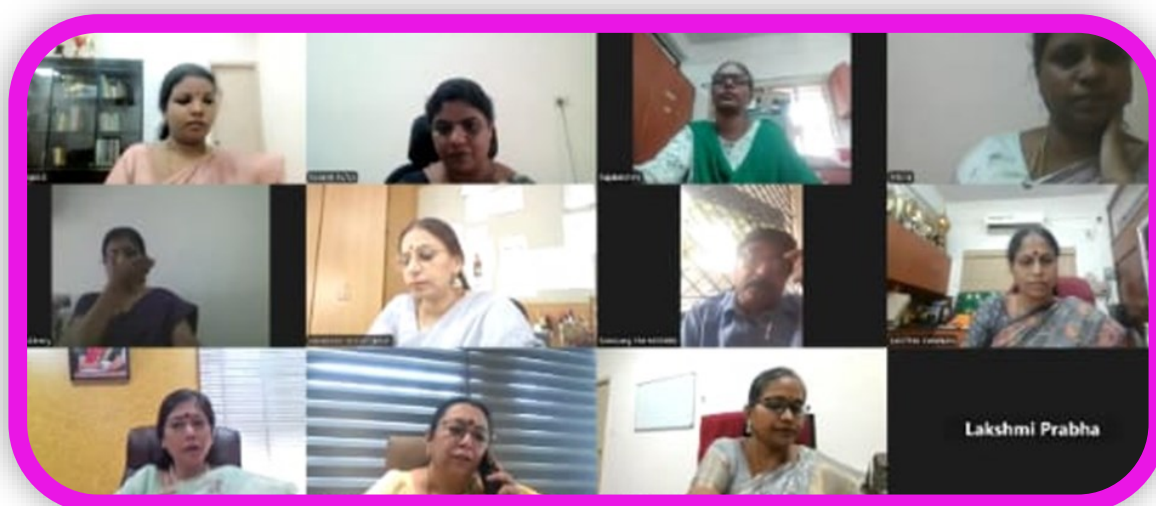
VISIT TO VATSALYA SPECIAL SCHOOL, TAMBARAM

NAVARATRI PROGRAM AT KUMARAN KUNDRAM TEMPLE

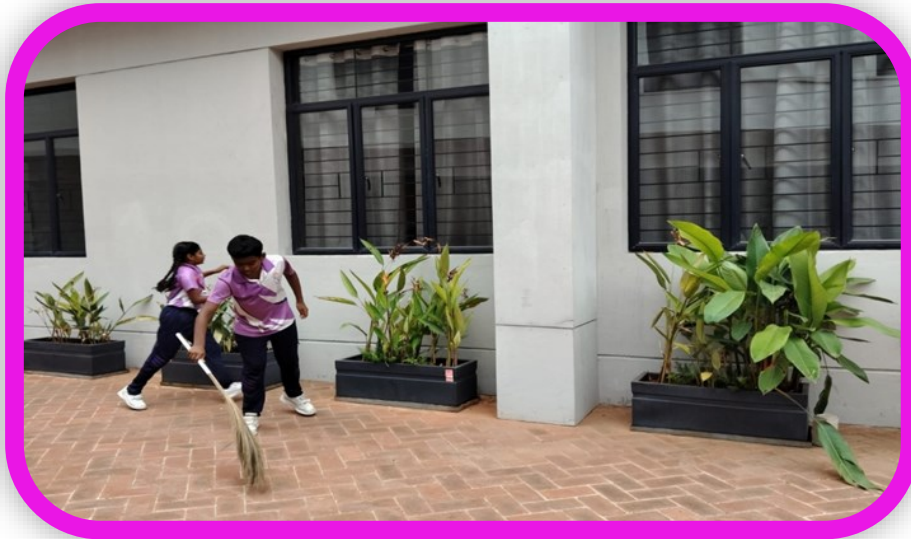

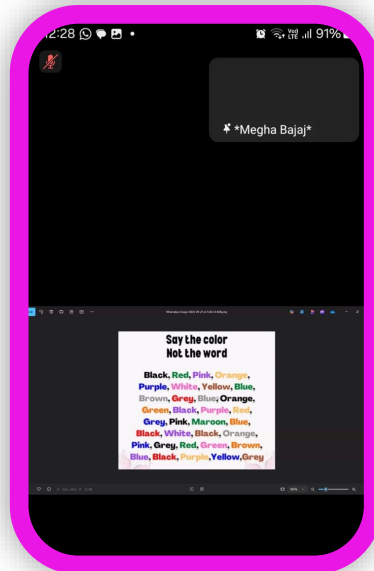
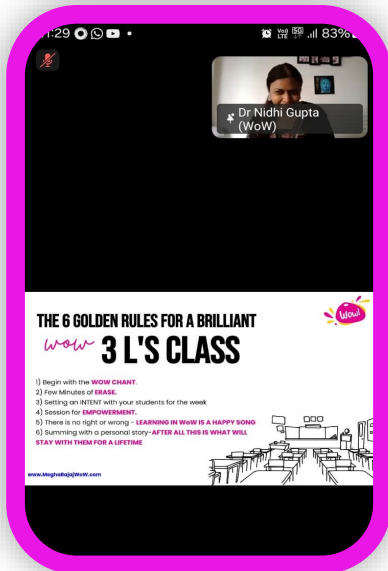
SESSION ON "CONCESSION AND EXEMPTION FOR CHILDREN "
