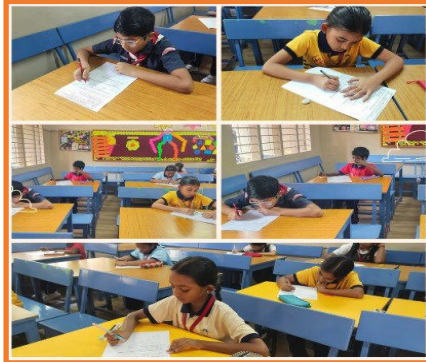




TAMIL SPELL BEE FINALE FOR SELECT STUDENTS OF STD III - VIII

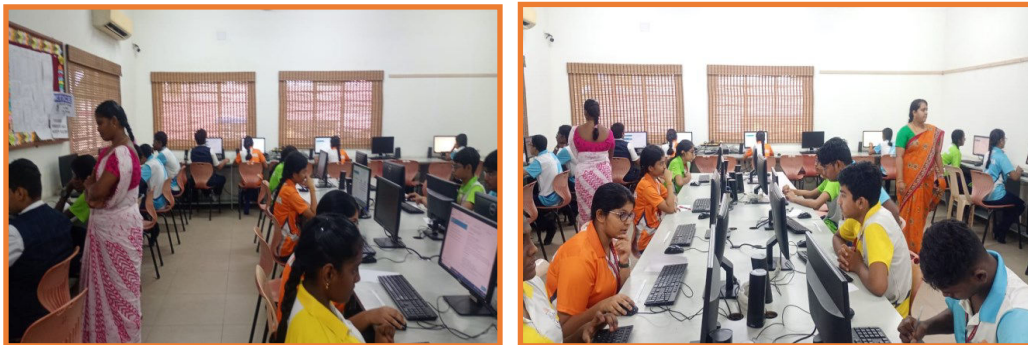
LOGIQIDS MENTAL APTITUDE OLYMPIAD FIRST LEVEL EXAM

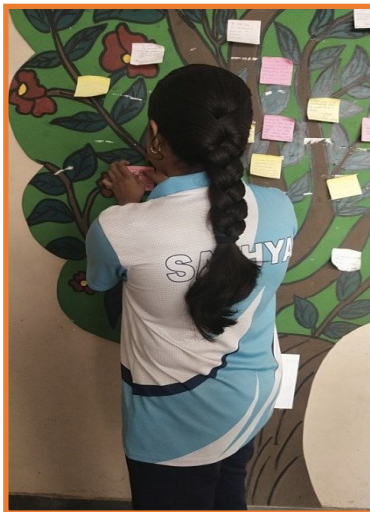


WILL POWER DRIVE

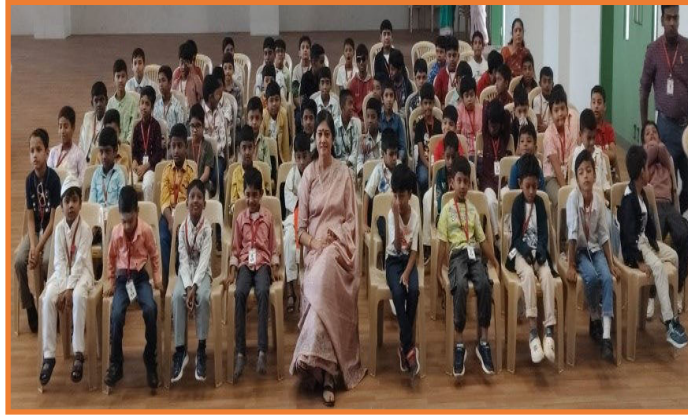
tions, bringing their roles to life on stage. The event fostered joy, self-expression, and learning, and every participant was appreciated with a certificate to encourage their efforts.

GREEN OLYMPIAD FOR THE STUDENTS OF STD. IV- VIII

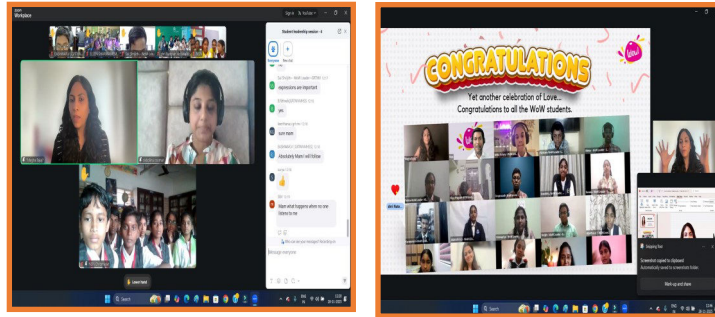

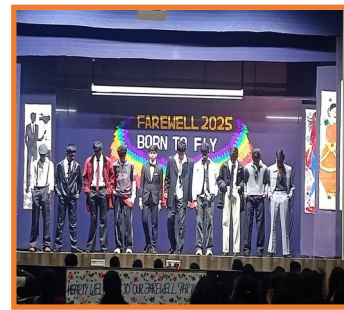
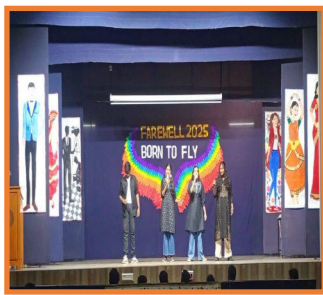
INTRAMURALS

FAREWELL CELEBRATION FOR STD XII

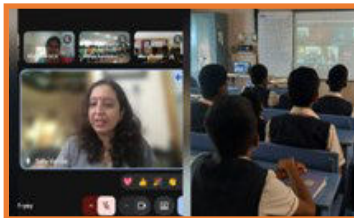

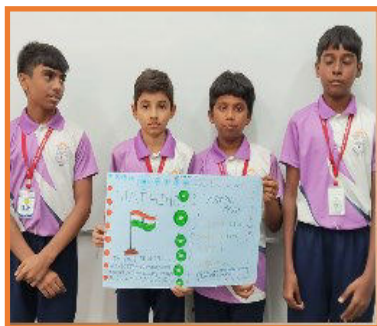
MATHRU PITHRU VANDANAM

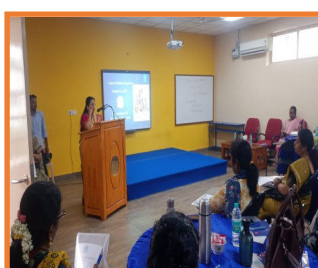




STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
