The session focused on concept clarity, problem-solving strategies, and exam-oriented preparation, helping students strengthen their confidence and performance



A subject expert session for Std. XII Chemistry was conducted by Mrs. Padmini Hari to strengthen conceptual understanding and enhance exam readiness. The session covered Hydroxy Compounds and Ethers, Carbonyl Compounds and Carboxylic Acids, and Organic Nitrogen Compounds. The resource person clearly explained reaction mechanisms, conversions, IUPAC nomenclature, and frequently asked board exam questions, while also sharing effective answering and presentation tips. STUDENT COUNSELLORS' SESSIONS

SESSION ON BEHAVIOUR

Std I students participated in a lively counselling session on 'Sit-Wait-Raise Hand,' where they were introduced to simple classroom routines in a fun and interactive way. Through actions, visuals, and short activities, students learned the importance of waiting patiently, sitting calmly, and participating appropriately. The session helped build self-control and encouraged positive classroom behaviour.



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SESSION ON ETIQUETTE

Students of Std II took part in an engaging session on Classroom Etiquette that focused on following rules, listening attentively, and using polite language. Through role-plays, games, and discussions, children practised appropriate classroom behaviour and learned how respect and cooperation make learning enjoyable for everyone.



SESSION ON RESPECTING BOUNDARIES

A guidance session on 'Understanding and Respecting Boundaries,' was conducted for Std III students to help them understand physical and emotional boundaries. Through interactive stories, role-plays, activities, and examples, students learned about personal space, consent, expressing feelings appropriately, saying "no," asking permission, and respecting others' feelings and belongings. The session concluded with a reflective drawing activity, reinforcing empathy, safe behaviour, and respectful peer interactions.



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SESSION ON MOVEMENT AND LANGUAGE ETIQUETTE

A session on 'Movement and Language Etiquette' was conducted for Std IV students to promote safe movement and respectful communication within the school. Students learnt about walking safely in corridors, the impact of words and tone on others' feelings, and the importance of empathy, through discussions, Q&A, and role-play activities. The session reinforced safe conduct and respectful interactions in the school environment.



MANAGING PEER PRESSURE AND GOSSIP

A guidance session on 'Managing Peer Pressure and Gossip' was conducted for Class V students. Through discussions, case studies, and reflective activities, students learned about peer influence, the impact of gossip, and healthy ways to respond to pressure. The Three Sieves Test was introduced to promote mindful communication, and the session concluded with an initiative to create a Kindness Wall in the classroom, encouraging students to write positive messages about their classmates on a daily basis to promote empathy and kindness.



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SESSION ON "SMART CHOICES, HEALTHY FEELINGS, RESPECTFUL WORDS"

A session on "Smart choices, Healthy feelings, & Respectful words," was conducted for class VI on 22.1.26. Through interactive discussions and story-based scenarios, students learned to distinguish between feelings and behavior, and reflected on how their actions affect others. They practiced making respectful choices such as supporting classmates instead of teasing; and together created a class agreement to promote kindness, active listening, and inclusive behaviour in their daily interactions.



SESSION ON 'THINK BEFORE YOU FOLLOW'

A session titled 'Think Before You Follow' was conducted for Class VII students on 20.01.26, focusing on peer influence and respectful decision-making. Through discussions and role-play, students explored the difference between popularity and respect, learned to resist negative peer pressure, and identified ways to support a safe and respectful classroom environment.



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SESSION ON RESPECTFUL BEHAVIOUR MATTERS

A guidance session was conducted on 10.1.26, for Std VIII students to promote respectful peer interactions both online and offline. The session addressed bullying, misuse of social media, spreading of rumours, and their emotional impact, while encouraging empathy, healthy boundaries, and responsible communication. Ongoing observation, guidance, and individual support will reinforce positive behaviour.



SESSION ON RESPECTFUL CLASSROOM CULTURE

A student counsellor session titled "Respectful Classroom Culture" was conducted for Class IX students on 07.01.2026 to promote appropriate classroom behaviour, inclusivity, and self-responsibility. Through interactive discussions and reflective activities, students explored the importance of empathy, respectful communication, and mindful decision-making. The session emphasised how personal choices and accountability contribute to building a positive and supportive learning environment.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

FINANCIAL EDUCATION TRAINING PROGRAM FOR THE MENTORS OF STD VI-XII

A Financial Education Training Program was conducted for teachers to promote awareness of effective money management and financial discipline. The resource person emphasized the importance of saving before spending and explained various saving and investment options such as savings accounts, recurring deposits, fixed deposits, PPF, and insurance plans. The session also covered budgeting, expense management, and emergency planning. Teachers were encouraged to share this knowledge with students and help them develop responsible saving habits. 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
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STEM LAB TRAINING FOR SCIENCE MENTORS
