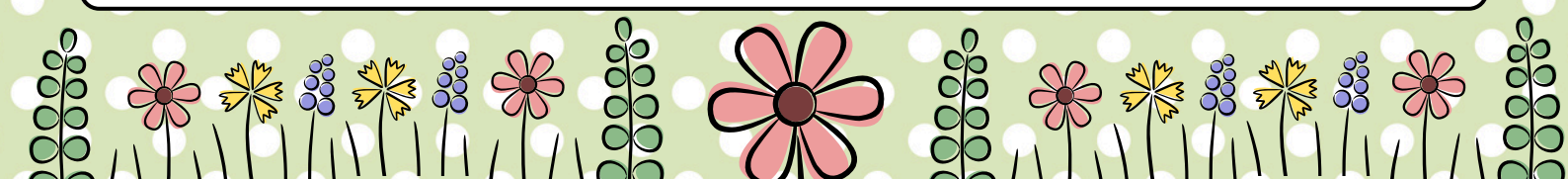

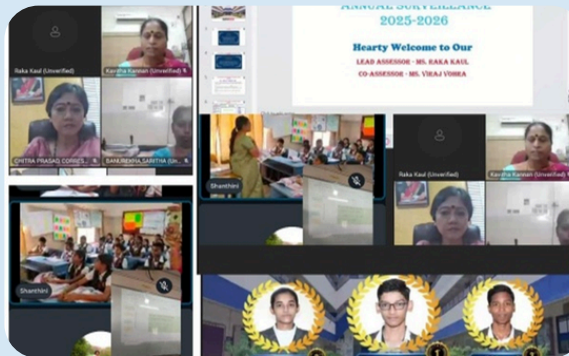

### DEAR Time (Drop Everything And Read)

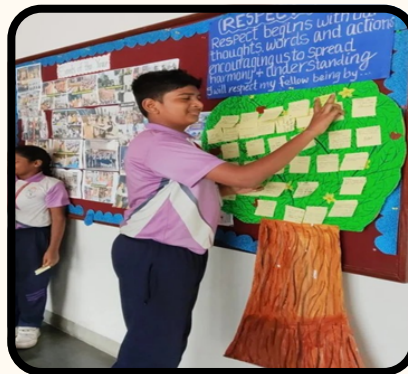

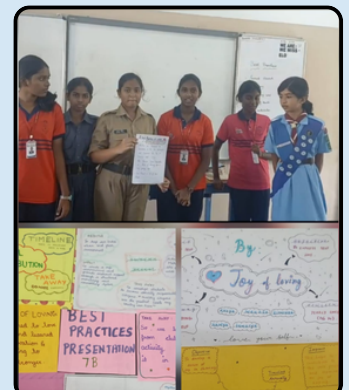
### ASSEMBLY PRESENTATION-WORLD DAY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE

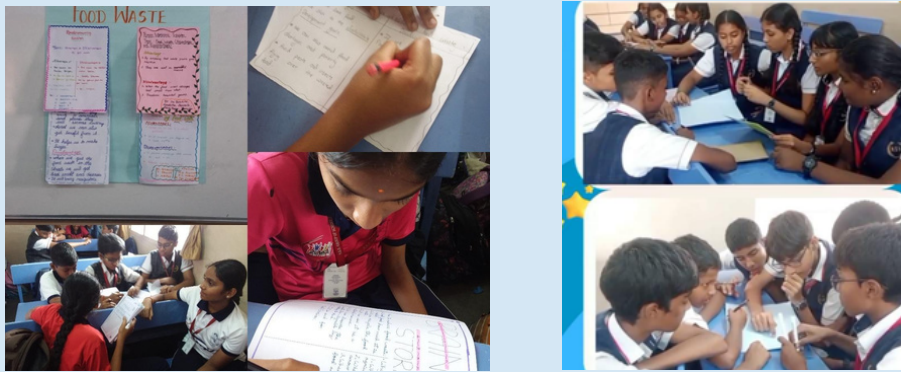

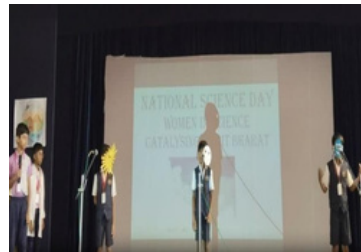
### CHRYSALIS DAY

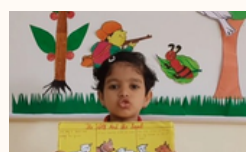
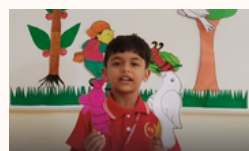
## BUNNY DAY CELEBRATION
