TRITIYA SOPAN TEST CAMP FOR SELECT SCOUTS AND GUIDES

The Tritiya Sopan Training Camp was held at the State Training Centre on April 10 and 11, 2026, to strengthen the practical expertise and discipline of our Scouts and Guides. 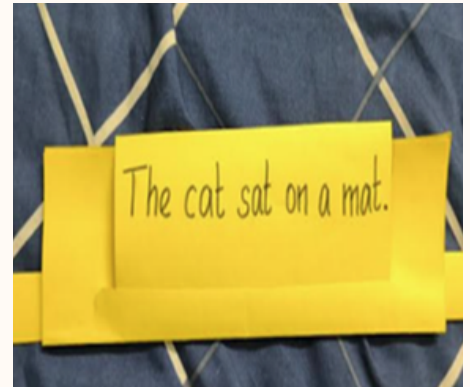
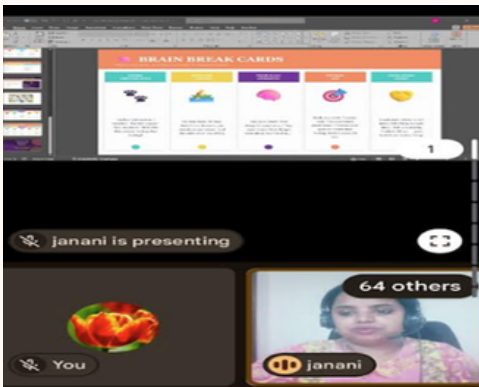
